


## Love!

Are you ready for three more reasons for worship?

If you are you are in the minority...

but we press on in Jesus' holy name.

Let's review the three reasons given last month to choose not to worship:

- Providential held back by God's hand due to sickness, or emergency.
- All kinds of sin from being busy, or just plain selfish.
- Worship calls us to repent and do better than what the world accepts or defines as good.

Here are reasons 37-39 for this month:


- So the big three of this month is that worship helps us resist temptation. When we are fed the nutrients of God's Gospel we are empowered to say no to sin every time. "I have stored up your Word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." Psalm 119:11. Worship is an extravaganza of God's Word. Let it, and the other power sources of Baptism, and the Lord's supper add to the feast of victory that helps us say no with great authority to all sorts of temptation. It can all start in worship.
- A second reason to run to worship with great zeal is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead," I Peter I:3. O come let us worship Him. Any other option is truly small, putrid and known to be in offense to the Holy One. "Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that He opened for us through the curtain, that is, through His flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water." Hebrews 10:19-22. He is risen! We worship without debate to hesitation.
- Singing is a great reason for worship, too. "My lips will shout for joy, when I sing praises to You; my soul also, which You have redeemed." Psalm 71:23. Love it! More please! "Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God." Colossians 3:16. One more time please. "Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the Rock of our salvation!" Psalm 95:1. Not attending worship is like telling God that He is no big deal anymore. Let us flee from such nonsense.

God calls upon us to make every effort to worship the Lord in His sanctuary. We most certainly can. All praise and glory to God our Creator and Redeemer. Be inspired and you can certainly inspire others. You are needed in the body of Christ. Keep in mind Jesus sings for you, He has risen for you, and He keeps you from temptation.


## **Joyfully Inspiring**

January kicked off our Joyfully Inspired daily devotions in alignment with the book, "New Morning Mercies,". This is also aligned with Pastor's weekly sermons. If you need a book or a study guide, they are available at the church.

Also, starting in January, we began hearing inspiring stories from our fellow congregants: stories about spouses, parents, grandparents, sisters, Bible study groups, people, situations and moments that touched lives and inspired connection to God's grace. Thank you to all those who have shared their inspirations in January.

In the introduction to "New Morning Mercies," Tripp writes:

"One of the stunning realities of the Christian life is that in a world where everything is in some state of decay, God's mercies never grow old. They never run out. They never are ill timed. They never dry up. They never grow weak. They never get weary. They never fail to meet the need. They never disappoint. They never, ever fail, because they really are new every morning."



In each of Tripp's daily devotionals, and each of Pastor's Sunday sermons, we are reminded of our humanness and need for help. God knew we would sin and provided rescue in His Son, Jesus. "We were not made to live independent, self-directed lives. We were not meant to exist according to our own little self-oriented plans, living for our own moments of glory. No, we were created to live for Him."

**February 5: "Celebrate or Mourn"** (Based on New Morning Mercies Feb 9)

"Today you will celebrate that grace has made you part of God's great plan or mourn the places where you aren't getting your own way."

**February 12: "God's Plan for You"** (Based on New Morning Mercies Feb 13)

"Faith isn't natural for us. Doubt is, fear is, and pride is, but faith in the words and works of another isn't, and for that there's grace."

**February 19: "Grace in Hardship"** (Based on New Morning Mercies Feb 19)

"When hardship comes your way, will you tell yourself it's a tool of God's grace and a sign of His love, or will you give in to doubting His goodness?"

**February 26: "Sin Is Our Need for Jesus"** (Based on New Morning Mercies Feb 29)

"Your life is not good because it is easy or predictable, but because the I Am has invaded your existence by His grace."




## **Prayer Chain**


## **Helping Hands**

# The Council met on January I I, 2023. Below is a Summary of Church Operations

We have signed a new I-year lease with The Treehouse preschool. The limitation of I year was necessary because of the "for-profit" status of The Treehouse. They are considering going to a non-profit status 403(b) which may allow for a reconsideration for a new multi-year contract in early 2023. Stay tuned – there are truly good things coming for both The Treehouse and Lakeside Lutheran Church.

Average attendance at services for the past year was 191. Our database shows approximately 353 members in our system - this includes full-time, part-time and associate members.

Pastor Dahlke has become the Head of Spiritual Care for a community group established in Sarasota County to assist when emergencies occur.

Pastor Dahlke said he received a "Call" from an LCMS congregation in Arlington, Texas. He encouraged all to communicate with him by phone, text, email cards, etc. to aide in consideration of that call.

Our finances continue to be in good order through positive revenues and keeping expenditures within approved budgets. Thank you Bill Meints, Larry Sheldrake and Terry Warner.

Our excellent Trustee crew continues with the cleaning-up and organizing our campus. They are continuing to evaluate the re-structuring of parts of our buildings to become a possible hub for future emergency responses.

Our Elder Board, under Pete Gardner, continue to provide structure and worship guidance to Lakeside. We have two new Elders on our board: Michael Mona and Kenneth Arney have been accepted by the church leadership and a couple of strong souls for helping guide the spiritual direction of our Church.

Our Member-at-Large, Susan Tenteromano, continues to enhance our church's forward momentum by her tireless work with special events in Meyer Hall and in exploring the commercial possibilities to spread awareness of Lakeside Lutheran to the outside community. The true outreach has to come from Lakeside Christians, along with the Holy Spirit, reaching out to others to invite them to the unchanging truth that our faith provides in this broken and confused world.







#### **CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS**

We hope everyone has picked up their 2023 contribution envelopes. If not, they will be available in the church office during regular business hours. A new year, new envelopes, so please discard your old 2022 envelopes because a few envelope numbers did change.

Many of you are using your financial institution's Bill Pay system to send in monthly contributions. This is one of several options, instead of making weekly contributions. Others are using the Recurring ACH Payment system using either a Debit or Credit card. In 2006, the Pension Protection Act allowed tax-payers age 70 ½ or older to make a tax free Qualified Charitable Distribution, called QCD, up to \$100,000. Many IRAs are eligible for QCDs along with Traditional, Rollover and Inherited funds. You direct your Trustee to make a distribution <u>directly</u> from your account to Lakeside, a qualified charitable institution. The QCDs counts toward satisfying any required minimum distribution you are required to make. The exclusion from gross income for QCDs also provides a tax-effective way for taxpayers who don't itemize deductions to make charitable contributions. Lakeside also has the ability to accept stock. Like the QCDs, your stockbroker must <u>directly</u> make a stock transfer to Lakeside. Talk to your financial advisor (Trustee) to process your contribution.
