

the Passover Seder (the feast of unleavened bread). It observes

the exodus of the Jews from Egypt (when they left so quickly there was no time for the bread to rise). The day is also associated with the foot-washing; Jesus washed the feet of the disciples, teaching them "servant leadership." Jesus instructs followers to love and to serve. Jesus also foretells His death, saying He will eat no more until the Kingdom of God is fulfilled. Finally, this day marks an act of betrayal of Judas Iscariot, pointed out by Jesus as the one who betrays Him.

Good Friday: At first glance, Good Friday seems like the ultimate misnomer. If Jesus suffered and died on this day, then why is it called Good? Good Friday is always tied to Easter Sunday, which is a joyful celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. He could not have been resurrected if he had not died first. With nail prints in His hands we remember the suffering of the crucifixion. We remember what Jesus did on the cross, which is the fulfillment of God's eternal plan for the whole world. Christians worldwide observe the somber holy day of Good Friday, which commemorates the suffering and crucifixion of Jesus. Jesus' example can provide strength through suffering. God really does understand what it's like to suffer, to be abandoned, to be alone. The events include the trial of Jesus, the shouts of the crowd to "Crucify him!", followed by Jesus carrying the cross and

being hung on it to die. Good Friday is powerfully significant partially because it gives us a glimpse into the depths of human evil. It's a time to reflect on the dark tendencies that are in all of us. It's a day to be silent, it's a day to remember, to focus on who Jesus is and what He meant for humanity.






Welcome to the last segment of why we worship. We have already covered 42 unshakable reasons why missing worship is unthinkable when we have faith in Jesus. Not to mention the disappointment to God who sent His Son to the cross in your place. When worship is all about us it is certainly becomes optional to our myopic pride. But in faith we hunger for it. Let's hit it.

Reason 43: We have the great joy to bring others with us to worship. I have one friend that invites multiple people each week by giving them a card that says "I will meet you at the door". He then waits at the door of the church for any of them to arrive. Because of his loving invite they often come. Psalm 66:5 "Come and see what God has done: He is awesome in His deeds toward the children of man." The come and see invitation by Philip and the angels (John I:46, Matthew 28:6) to see Jesus is still viable today.





Reason 44: Worship gives us unity in in the Word, in purpose, and mission. It stops backsliding and keeps us in truth and purity. It is vital that a congregation never comprise the Word with a noisy sinfilled culture. Worship brings clarity to His values, His purpose and His will for our lives. Psalm 119:105 "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

Reason 45: In worship you have opportunity to grow and use the fruits of the Spirit. Most church attenders never use these gifts in worship. Galatians 5:22-23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." How can each of these be used in a worship service to touch the lives of another person? Do people know that you genuinely love them in worship? Do people see or even feel your joy? Do they see your frustration of life or your peace in Jesus? The questions can go on, but try to actively use your fruits of the Spirit to impact many other people in worship. Imagine if 50 people intentionally did this each service?



## The Fruit of the Spirit

But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! (Galatians 5:22-23)

#### **Joyfully Inspiring**

Did you give up something for Lent? I researched this tradition and found it has an uncertain beginning. LCMS authors write that giving things up "for Lent" – chocolate, caffeine, other indulgences – might put the emphasis on us rather than on Jesus. Is it time for us to stop giving things up and use this sacred time to take things up instead? For example, daily devotions, prayer, bible studies, hearing His Word, receiving His gifts, sharing the joy of Jesus in our lives, taking up our cross, strengthening our relationship with Him. Lent is a season of preparation and repentance, turning toward our risen Savior on Easter in joy and gratitude for what He gave up for us. His suffering and death took away the sin of the world (1 John 29). Our salvation is certain! Can I get an alleluia? Alleluia!

Pastor's April sermons hone in on our relationship with Jesus and God's faithfulness to us. As David Tripp wrote in the April 20 devotional that will serve as the basis for the April 16 message, "Grace doesn't make it okay for you to live for you. No, grace frees you to experience the joy of living for One greater than you."

Thank you to those who shared their joyful inspirations with us in March. We are truly blessed by God's grace that transforms us and gives us amazing joy in knowing our sins are forgiven, our debt has been paid.

#### 40 Tables of God's Love - 2023

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Acts 2:42

In the Bible, we see that Jesus used the table throughout His ministry. He loved coming together and enjoying food around a table. It was an opportunity for Him to share in fellowship and bring the Gospel to His neighbors. The dinner table has long been a place of connection, healing of brokenness, and a loving blessing to the participants in Jesus' name.

<u>Goals</u>: To create a joyful fellowship of meals, inspiring stories, and prayer for people both in the congregation and those struggling, confused, hurting, or apart from God's grace in our homes.

**Motivation**: We have been saved by grace in Jesus and desire that salvation for all people.

**Strategy**: During the months of May, June and July we will seek to have 20 meals within our fellowship of believers. In August, September, and October we will seek to have 20 meals with a mix of believers and non-believers or people who are struggling, confused, hurting, or apart from God's grace in our homes.

#### May, June and July the participants will:

- Invite 2-6 people to a table.
- Have a meal that creates an environment of joy, peace, and kindness.
- Start the meal with a common prayer.
- Those present have an opportunity to share his or her story with the group about what God is doing or has done in their lives? (Specific for a believing table.)
- Take a photo of the table with the people to add to the "40 Tables of God's Love" church display.
- Lead a prayer of thanks and praise or other intercessions.

#### August, September, and October the participants will:

- Invite 2-6 people in your home with at least two of them who are struggling, confused, hurting, or apart from God's grace. Some can be disciples from your first meal or they can all be different.
- Have a meal that creates an environment of joy, peace, and kindness.
- Start the meal with a common prayer.
- Those present have an opportunity to share his or her story with the group about what is going on in their life. You may share your story of God if you so choose.
- Take a photo of the table with the people to add to the "40 Tables of God's Love" church display.
- Lead a prayer of thanks and praise or other intercessions.

#### Follow Up:

Follow up with you guests in about 40 days and see if they could see any prayers that were answered.

Determine if you can continue your relationship with them in prayer and fellowship.

Discover what you can do next in the relationship?

You may certainly do more than the two tables if you want.



(We may have a fellowship meal in October in Meyer Hall to celebrate the 40 tables of God love.)

#### Do you have an unbelieving family member and wondering what to do about it?

Dilemma: Accepting a shallow relationship with someone who is literally flesh of our flesh is difficult, but sharing our inner selves is very hard with unsaved adult children. Since God is the basis of our lives, and they usually don't want to hear about Him, relationships tend to stay on the surface. This is more than a dilemma it's heartbreaking and can cause pain and loss of sleep that all leads to poorer health.

Read one person's story. My daughter grew up in church. She won AWANA awards, performed in church plays, did sign language in worship services, had quiet times, and even led to Christ a friend who today is in Bible college. She knows the truth about God. Nothing I can say or do will push a spiritual button that will "fix" her. Her relationship with God is literally out of my hands.

- ⊕ Keep communication open. Are you walking on egg shells? Maintaining communication is often difficult and shallow. A wrong word can easily break it. This can create estrangement or weeks of silence.
- ♣ Look for common ground and build from there.
- † Find someone to pray and talk with about this. You are not alone.

Here are four things to help your unbelieving family member:

- Pray this means you keep loving them no matter what they have become.
- Ask impactful question. Intentionally think of questions to discover and understand where they are coming from in their life.
- $\oplus$  Listen You may have to listen 90% of the time while your 10% is doing the hard work asking the right questions. Perhaps the Holy Spirit will create an opportunity to plant a seed along the way.
- Property Repeat We need not give up or take responsibility for their unbelief. Stay healthy in the Gospel.

Prayer: Lord, help me not to panic as my adult child wrestles with their beliefs in You. Give me strength to be a compassionate listener, willing to truly hear my child's heart on the matter. Help me love them with tender support as they make sense of You. Thank You for carrying me while I support them. Give me courage to listen and not judge. Amen.


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
