This little Bible verse shows a value. The Bible is full of them and so is the world (and many are not too good). When others see your values they may just see Jesus in you too.

Why Do We Use Values in Ministry?

Values are why we are doing what we do. We all have them. Even those people outside of grace have values even if they are corrupt and selfish. Values dictate and explain our behavior. They guide every decision we make, every goal we set, or ministry we form, every dime we spend. Values tell the world what we stand for, this is what we are all about, this is who we are, this is what we can do for you. Values give us our unique identity. You usually can find values on various websites in an area that say "Who we are" in their language. Values form the common thread that runs through the entire ministry of a congregation. Values shape the character of the congregation, too. Our values come from Jesus and our values show Jesus to others.

Values Communicate What Is Important

In doing God's work, your personal values need to align with the ministry you are working with at any given time. If this is not the case, ministry will be disjointed and run in many directions with little unity and teamwork. Your commitment to these values matters greatly for the bearing of fruit as a congregation in Jesus' name. They help everyone to focus their energy on what is truly important to the ministry of the congregation. We seek to *joyfully inspire other in their spiritual growth and discipleship*.

Values Embrace Positive Change...

... but do not need to Change

Values are designed by God to be timeless in and with His Son. They are helpful in bringing peace because they, like the Bible, do not change over time. We learn to adapt to a changing culture, but our values need not change. These beliefs are so important that they must always come before ministry policies, practices, goals, and politics. This is hard stuff in corrupt and evil generation.

Values Inspire People to Action

When leaders work off strong Biblical beliefs, they carry it through with both words and actions from their heart. This makes the ministry credible in the eyes of others. Most churches are on the cusp of either valuing apathy or Christ in them to bare fruit. We pray for the latter value, for this is the way others see Jesus in a hard world.

Joyfully Inspiring

What does it mean when something is "hardwired"? In computers or electricity, it means circuits are physically or permanently connected. In people, it refers to actions and behaviors that are instinctive and automatic. We are hardwired to breathe. We are hardwired to seek comfort and flee danger. (Some of us seem hardwired to love chocolate...) Above all, we are hardwired to live for God. We can ignore Him, sidestep His plan, and dismiss His law, but we cannot deny we were created in His image and connected to Him by means of creation.

Let's check our wiring in May. May is the month of spring and all the renewal it brings. Pastor's May sermons center around how we live, what rules our hearts, and our willingness to do what God clearly calls us to do. In his May 14 devotional, David Tripp writes, "You were hardwired to live for God, so even though you may not be aware of it, every good thing or bad thing you do today has verticality to it." We are hardwired to God.

Thank you to those who shared their joyful inspirations with us in April. God is always working to complete the plan He's begun in each of us.

Preview of May sermon themes:

May 7: All Things God (Based on New Morning Mercies May 12) "You were hardwired to live for God, so even though you may not be aware of it, every good thing or bad thing you do today has verticality to it."

May 14: Goodbye Conflict (Based on New Morning Mercies May 19) "If your heart isn't ruled by God's honor and your life by God's plan, you may seem religious, but what you're living isn't biblical faith."

May 21: Living Faith (Based on New Morning Mercies May 26) "Faith is living in light of what God has said, resting in what he has done, and entrusting the future to his care."

May 28: Rest and Work (Based on New Morning Mercies Jun 2) "It never works to ask people to do for you what only God can do. It never works to wait for God to do what he has clearly called you to do."

Lakeside Continues to Rally After Hurricane Ian

Hurricane lan made landfall in our area on September 28, 2022. Soon after, Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) and Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) contacted Lakeside Lutheran to request we serve as a host site for their teams.



Over a hundred Lakeside volunteers helped support their mission. We rallied, and with God's help, we extended the hands and feet of Jesus into our community.

What has happened since those early days of hurricane recovery? A group of people completed Basic LERT Training, Pastor has connected with service groups in Sarasota County and beyond, Lakeside volunteers continue helping people in need after lan, and the church started thinking, "How can we continue to serve before, during and after a disaster?"

The Council had our Council meeting on 4/12/2023, below is a Summary of our Church's Joyful operations.

We are exploring stronger potential outreach with The Treehouse preschool and getting more congregants involved. A letter was sent out to the parents of the preschoolers inviting them to see their children in the Wednesday Children's Chapel in our

church. It is beginning to spark interest from the parents. Perhaps the children really are the crown of mature Christians and an inspiration to them. (Proverbs 17:6)

Our Band of Brothers is becoming more successful. We have been enjoying a web seminar by David Jeremiah: <u>The Apathy of America</u>. We will be following it with <u>The Remedy of Revival</u> with some possible outreach action to trumpet the fading faith and values that is causing us to crumble as a society. The Fire is started! Diane Emo has stepped out to lead our L.E.R.T. (Lutheran Emergency Response Team) follow-up effort here at Lakeside! We have formed, and are growing, our own reach out and help group; I believe it will be called LAM (Lakeside Action Ministry).

Our Finances, under Treasurer Larry Sheldrake, continue to be managed accurately and with a positive direction. Our only debt at this point is our mortgage balance \$35,691 and that should be paid off and retired later this year. Thank you Lord for supporting Your House of Ministry and worship through the generosity of your congregants and the fire that Your Holy Spirit ignites in our hearts.

Our Member-at-Large, Susan Tenteromano, continues to outreach through media to our growing population here in Venice and North Port. Yes, we expect our Church to grow as more people awaken to the fact that the only truth that is unchanging can be found in our faith and not in the promises of the secular world.

Lee Knudsvig, our Head Trustee and his trusty crew, are keeping our campus in good operating condition. The major repairs to our ageing plumbing in the sanctuary should be completed by May 1st.

Our Elder board, headed by Pete Gardner, continues to provide structure and worship guidance to Lakeside. We are looking for two more men with the potential to help lead the worship and faith growth here at Lakeside. Be bold and step forward like Christ and the disciples if you have the Holy Spirit leading you.

Sometimes the people in the background get little notice, but they are instrumental in keeping the pulse of the Lakeside family vibrant. Please say thank you when you see them.

COMMUNITY GARDEN - SHARE THE LOVE OF CHRIST

A community garden is designated for sharing gardening. As people in Venice choose apartments or homes with less acreage, this type of growing may be something that interest you? **Come Grow With Us!** Contact Brenda (office administrator) if you are interested in muddying your shoes...

Gardening is a valuable hobby. Healthy produce and saving money is just some of it's benefits. Many families are struggling to afford fresh foods. By providing a share garden, church members and families can help themselves to homegrown foods. In addition, the garden offers an opportunity for Treehouse Pre-School students to learn more about food growth and healthy eating. Finally, South County Food Pantry may be interested in taking some of our fresh produce?

FIRST, WE MUST GAUGE INTEREST FROM OUR MEMBERS

We are trying to determine if there is interest in a community garden. (This might be a one-year trial if there is not interest.) With sufficient interest, the next step is to determine what type of garden would be most useful. We could grow fruits and vegetables, trees, herbs, flowers or a combination.

FINDING A PLOT: We have land determined to be unused, but it would be great for gardens. It is located just behind the choir room and classroom area. This area is free of debris and offers 6-8 hours of sun, as well as access to a water spicket and garden tool closet.

PREPARING THE AREA: Would you like to join our gardening group? People can volunteer time to the garden, or volunteer financially (to purchase soil, fertilizers, seeds, tools or other items needed). Would you like to be a Weeder or Seeder? Email Brenda at <u>llc@lakesidelutheran.net</u>

PLANNING THE GARDEN: Gardening classes and meetings may be necessary for establishing a layout for our garden. We are blessed to have Bob Holmes (horticulture expert) as a beneficial resource for gardening endeavors. Can you dig it? We are eager to Ready-Set-Grow!

MANAGING THE GARDEN: Once the garden is operational, we will need people to oversee the garden bed management. Are you in? Hi Hoe, Hi Hoe, It's off to work we go... Interested?

- SUMMER MISSION -

This summer we are going to try to go a little further in the mission God has for us through the "40 Tables of God's Love". (You can find out more about the 40 Tables of God's Love on the following page of this newsletter.) Who can be your first table of fellowship and who can be your second? Begin praying about it.

I wonder how many times meals are talked about in the Bible. Table fellowship was an integral part of Jesus' ministry and yours as well. Jesus frequently used the occasion of a meal to create fellowship with people. For us it is an outpouring of our love for others because of God's great love for us. God's love is truly sacrificial to bring us to a spot of love for Him. For some of us a fellowship meal is truly sacrificial. The good news is that when we do table fellowship, Christ is present with us. The atmosphere around the table is one of acceptance, friendship, and peace. It gives us a view of what heaven is like as well.

I also what to mention the three parts that make up a fellowship meal: Jesus presence, sharing our story, and eating in the beautiful atmospheres of acceptance, friendship, and peace. We will look at these more next month. It truly is beautiful when we see Christ working in us to touch the lives of others around our table.

Do you remember in Luke 24:40-43 the meal he had with his disciples after his resurrection as he appeared in a house?

And when He had said this, He showed them His hands and His feet. While they still could not believe it because of their joy and amazement, He said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave Him a piece of a broiled fish and He took it and ate it before them.



Jesus went on to teach, eat and share. When we open up our tables, or join others at the table, we bring the incarnate Christ into the meal because He is in and with us. Whose lives can be inspired around the table with you because of your faith. People are hungry both physically and spiritually. We can fill them with God's love because God's love fills us. No wonder we have an Easter breakfast.

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Acts 2:42

In the Bible, we see that Jesus used the table throughout His ministry. He loved coming together and enjoying food around a table. It was an opportunity for him to share in fellowship and bring the Gospel to his neighbors. The dinner table has long been a place of connection, healing of brokenness, and a loving blessing to the participants in Jesus' name.

Goals: To create a joyful fellowship of meals, inspiring stories, and prayer for people both in the congregation and those struggling, confused, hurting, or apart from God's grace.

Motivation: We have been saved by grace in Jesus and desire that salvation for all people. Strategy: During the months of May, June and July we will seek to have 20 meals within our fellowship of believers. In August, September, and October we will seek to have 20 meals with a mix of believers and non-believers or people who are struggling, confused, hurting, or apart from God's grace in our homes.

The participants will:

Invite 2-6 people to a table for the following:

- ✤ Have a meal that creates an environment of joy, peace, and kindness. Start the meal with a common prayer.
- Those present have an opportunity to share his or her story with the group about what God is doing or has done in their lives? Specific for a believing table.
- ✤ Take a picture of the table with the people to add to the "50 Tables of God's Love" display in the church.
- ✤ Lead a prayer of thanking and praise or other intercessions.

Invite 2-6 people in your home with at least two of them who are struggling, confused, hurting, or apart from God's grace (some can be disciples from your first meal).

- ✤ Have a meal that creates an environment of joy, peace, and kindness. Start the meal with a common prayer.
- Those present have an opportunity to share his or her story with the group about what is going on in their life. You may share you story of God if you so choose.
- ✤ Take a picture of the table with the people to add to the "50 Tables of God's Love" display in the church.
- ✤ Lead a prayer of thanking and praise or other intercessions.
 - Follow up with you guests in about 40 days and see if any prayers were answered they could see.

Determine if you can continue your relationship with them in prayer and fellowship. Discover what you can do next in the relationship?

You may certainly do more that the two tables if you want.


We may have a fellowship meal in October in Meyer Hall to celebrate 40 tables of God love.
