Why "Fellowship" Is So Much More

Fellowship is a word used to describe a close relationship between people. The word "fellowship" in Scripture is speaking of the close relationship Christians have with the Lord, "God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (*ICor. I:9*) The gospel brings us all into communion, into family, into partnership, into association with one another. John said he and the other apostles were preaching the gospel, "So that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ" (*IJohn I:3*). It's not entirely accurate to say we get together with our church family to fellowship. We need to stop thinking of fellowship as something we do, and start thinking of it as something we have. People should be able to look at the rela-



tionship between Christians and say, "Do you see the fellowship they have? Isn't that a beautiful thing!" That's the way it was in the earliest days of the church (Acts 2:42-47): Many Christians do not experience true fellowship; they show up for worship and then slip out the back door. They don't discuss Scripture, share intimate prayer, join with any groups, know the needs of others, or share their belongings with those in need.

Can people see the fellowship you have with the church family? Jesus said, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). If there are no indicators of the fellowship we have with our brothers and sisters in Christ, how are people supposed to see our love?

Fellowship begins with worship service, but Lakeside has many gatherings such as 40 Tables of God, potluck dinners and Bread Breakers just to name a few. These opportunities help to encourage the strengthen fellowship. Fellowship will not be strengthened without ample time together. We must realize we are not getting together to fellowship, we are getting together because we are in fellowship.



"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near" (Hebrews 10:24-25).



The Quest for Discipleship

Can you define a disciple? Disciple: Someone who believes, follows, and shares Jesus. He or she is committed to being a lifelong student of Jesus; someone learning to master life through imitating the Lord. God is intentional in his or her lifestyle and faith journey.

The main characteristics of a disciple includes faithfulness to the Lord, living a fruitful life of service, and having a passion for one's calling in life. But what about discipleship? It is the process of transformation every Christian undertakes to become more like Christ. It includes the systems, methods, and environments we create to guide another along his or her journey of Christ formation.


The destination of discipleship is to be a person who loves God and loves others with the love of God. Their earthy goal is making disciples that make more replicating disciples. When is the last time you talked about this over table fellowship? Imagine thousands of churches taking note that the worship service is not the end game for church members, but it is to inspire them to go and disciple. This gets way more push back than celebration. This gets way more lip service than boots on the ground.

Let's talk about Christ formation. Christ formation begins with God, not us. God calls us into a relationship with Him. The formation begins with God because it was He who first reached out to us, in offering us the forgiveness of our sins and then inviting us into the lifelong process of becoming more like Him. Christ formation means knowing Christ personally and intimately, not just knowing facts about Him. Christ formation means understanding our value because we are created in the image and the likeness of God. People have value because God created them, and because Jesus died for them. Therefore, God determines a person's value, and when we truly believe this, it changes the way we treat people. Christ formation teaches us that God is for us, not against us. Rather than running from God to hide, we run to Him to confess and bask in grace and deliverance. Christ formation shows us

the importance of our relationship with other Christians. Christ formation means understanding Godly sorrow. This is when you know that your sin hurts God and you want to stop your sinful actions.

What does your Christ formation look like? I would love to talk with you about it, if you seriously are ready to do something different. It means moving from passive Christianity into joyfully inspiring others. It means stepping out of critiquing church stuff - to being Jesus in the lives of the lost and the found. I think you may be ready.

Prayer surrenders our plans for the wiser plans of another. Prayer puts us in our rightful place. Prayer acknowledges our weaknesses. Prayer reminds us that there is so much we don't know or understand. "All to Thee my blessed Savior, I surrender all."

No wonder Jesus taught us to pray! It is not natural for us to surrender our will and wisdom, and to embrace our weakness and failure. Pastor's June sermons take us from hope, to prayer, to redemption, to the difference between amazement and faith. "God doesn't just want to blow your mind; he wants to rule your heart." Thy kingdom come, thy will be done!

Thank you to those who shared their joyful inspirations with us in May, and for the beautiful voices of our preschool children in their weekly "Kid's Church." Lakeside Lutheran continues to reach out to others with God's loving grace.

Church Council Article June 2023

The Council had our meeting on 5/10/2023; here is a Summary of Church Joyful operations:

We are exploring stronger potential outreach with The Treehouse preschool and getting more congregants involved. A letter was sent out to the parents of the preschoolers inviting them to see their children in the **Wednesday Children's Chapel.** The invitation is beginning to spark interest from the parents. Perhaps the children really are the **crown** of mature Christians and an inspiration to them (see Proverbs 17:6).

Our <u>Band of Brothers</u> is becoming more successful. The video seminar by David Jeremiah has inspired extraordinary response: <u>The Apathy of America</u> – followed with <u>The Remedy of Revival.</u> In light of the declining cultural values and it's effect on our faith and worship, something needs to be done and not just talked about. We plan to have an open-video and seminar in June to fire-up and inspire some real action by Christians – Lakeside and otherwise (the date and time to be announced). The Fire is started! Join us on Saturday morning at 8:30 in the Youth Room. The Band of Brothers participated in a "shutter practice" for emergency installation on the Treehouse preschool building – after sorting out much of the clutter of confusion we have organized everything and can install all shutters in about 1½ hours. We have also posted open invitations to many Christian churches in the area to attend the Worship Songs on the Beach (Venice beach every Friday, I hour before sunset.)

Diane Emo has stepped out to lead our <u>CREW</u> (<u>Christians Ready Equipped and <u>Willing</u>) follow up effort here at Lakeside! We are growing our own Reach-out-and-Help group. We have been organizing and attending ways to work through the emergency response Expos in both North Port and Venice.</u>

Our Finances, under Treasurer Larry Sheldrake, continue to be managed accurately and with a positive direction. Our new asset value at Lakeside is over \$4 million and our only debt at this point is our mortgage balance \$30,517 (and that should be paid off and retired later this year). Thank you Lord for supporting your House of Ministry and worship through the generosity of your congregants and the fire Your Holy Spirit ignites in our hearts.

Our Member-at-Large, Susan Tenteromano, continues to outreach through media to our growing population here in Venice and North Port. Yes, we expect our Church to grow as more people awaken to the fact that the only truth that is unchanging can be found in our faith – and not in the promises of the secular world.

Lee Knudsvig, our Head Trustee, and his trusty crew are keeping our campus in good operating condition even directing from his Northern office. The major repairs to our ageing plumbing in the narthex are completed. The cost was mitigated by the construction expertise of Lee (see *photo on Page 13*). Dan will be a surrogate go-to trustee until Lee returns.

Our Elder board, under Pete Gardner, continue to provide structure and worship guidance to Lakeside. There is a job in progress to upgrade our use of the Church database and add photos for all people so we can produce a new Church photo directory in the near future (see more information on page 7).

Sometimes the people in the background get little noticed - A shout-out to just a few: Sharon Ladigoski, Arlene Haegel, Janet Gardner - and there are so many others.







40 Tables of God's Love

Table Fellowship:

Are you being Jesus at meal time or being something else?

Why is table fellowship of great importance both to the early Christian church and to us today? Can you think of a few reasons? Table fellowship is a theme throughout the Bible, and is used to teach the stories of God to God's people and beyond. The stories of God's prophets often involve eating and sharing the things of God that were needed to be shared and to



connect with eternity. It seems like Jesus was always eating with someone for the same salvation. The Last Supper points to Christ's own sacrifice for our life, and to the Great Banquet that will be held for all of us in heaven. The early Church continued the table fellowship both in daily meals and in holy communion, and so do we.

Christ is present in all of our table fellowship because we are the temple of Christ. (I Cor 6:19) Christ's presence at the table means that we recognize that God is the giver of all good things. We see that Jesus is the "true bread of life." (John 6:33-48) When we eat together, we welcome the Lord's presence. When in the presence of the Lord, we joyfully celebrate the gift of food, the gift of Christ's sacrifice, and the promise of His presence both now and in the future when we partake in the eternal banquet.

God's desire for His people is wonderful table fellowship. It leads us right into the Lord's Table. These relationships are made to be marked with love, and eating is a time of celebration of God's goodness.

What does table fellowship look like when you invite some people that need the presence of Jesus through you? Stay tuned next month for some thoughts on Table fellowship. But I can't hold back - here are six ingredients that go into table fellowship:

Inviting non-Christians
Building community & unity
Expressing present and future hope


Introducing...The Lakeside CREW!

In the past few months we've talked about the "LERT follow-up team," a group of people who started meeting after Hurricane lan with a desire to help others. This group has evolved into a new ministry called the Lakeside CREW (Christians Ready Equipped and Willing). This externally focused ministry seeks to serve the needs of our congregation, campus and community in preparation and response to adverse situations, such as a storm, tragedy or unexpected event.



What is an externally focused ministry?

Externally focused ministries and churches integrate good news and good deeds. Jesus was externally focused. He was out in the community, connecting with people through tangible, relevant acts of love,



kindness and healing. By being externally focused, churches have the chance to build relationships and share God's grace in the midst of real need. Through their actions, lives are transformed as people both see and hear God's love. All of us are part of an externally focused ministry. Everything done inside our church doors strengthens, prepares and equips us for loving outreach to our families, friends, and communities.

So, where do we start?

The CREW established some A-list priorities with the goal of preparing for the upcoming storm season. The four projects listed below are actively in motion. Pastor is also part of the Sarasota County Long Term Recovery Group (LTRG), a "cooperative body made up of representatives from faith-based, non-profit, government, business, and other organizations working within a community to assist individuals and families as they recover from disaster." Simply, they will match resources to needs. Once we have defined the Lakeside CREW's support niche, we intend to be part of their resource pool. Then what? Going forward, we plan to leverage our campus and resources to house youth and service groups that come into our community to minister to others. Let's see where the Lord leads Lakeside in outreach!

What can you do to help today?

Pray. Lift up this new ministry. One member shared her prayer for the CREW: "Dear God, I pray for the Lakeside CREW as it seeks to be of service to others. Please guide their steps and grant them wisdom and energy to be the hands, feet, hearts and listening ears of Jesus to those in need. Thank you for all of your faithful servants at Lakeside who first seek to serve you. Amen."


