



Francis Scott Key was born August 1<sup>st</sup> 1779. We all know him as the man who wrote our national anthem "The Star-Spangled Banner". Many of us know that he was aboard a ship, the Tonnant, as he watched the assault of the English rockets on Fort McHenry in Baltimore throughout the night in 1814. But did you know that he was on an enemy ship? He was tasked by President Madison to go to this English ship and negotiate the release of an American prisoner named Dr. William Beanes. He accomplished this task but they were both detained on the ship because of the eminent attack on Baltimore. There he witnessed and shared an event that inspires a nation.



We tend to be impressed by his talent of poetry as a historical battle goes on before Key's eyes. Rightly so! But what caught me was something different. He was sent into enemy territory to secure the release of a captive.




HE CAME TO SET THE CAPTIVES FREE

#### The Council meeting was held July 12, 2023

We are exploring stronger potential outreach with The Treehouse Preschool. At a recent meeting we were presented with the possibility of splitting the Treehouse into two sections: Regular non-profit preschool and a profit oriented Home-School section. The Council has requested a more detailed and written description of the plan. Elizabeth is working on that plan. Our concern is protecting our tax-exempt status. The Treehouse has agreed to fund any changes needed. The Home-School aspect may portend getting more older children involved on our campus if we have congregant participation and encouragement.





Our Band of Brothers is continuing to inspire an enthusiasm from our men to bring our faith to others: <u>The Apathy of America</u> – followed with <u>The Remedy of Revival</u> by David Jeremiah will be presented to our congregation and Christians-at-large in October. "In light of the declining cultural values and it's effect on our faith and worship, something needs to be done and not just talked about." We are presently reviewing the Apologetics (Christians arguments and writings in justification of our faith doctrine). We have an open invitation to all men to join us on Saturday mornings for some deep-faith exploration.

Our Finances under Treasurer Larry Sheldrake – continue to be managed accurately and with a positive direction. Our net asset value at Lakeside is over \$4 million and our only debt at this point is our mortgage balance \$30,000 and that should be paid off and retired later this year. Thank you Lord for supporting Your House of Ministry and worship through the generosity of your congregants and the fire Your Holy Spirit ignites in our hearts.





The recent power-surge and circuit-board damage was handled swiftly by Ken Gustafson and Ryan Kraus. There are still some unfinished repairs in process – but the cost to the church is being handled efficiently.




#### SOWING SEEDS OF PEACE

Want to see a miracle? Try this. Take a seed the size of a freckle. Put it in dirt. Give it enough water, light, and fertilizer. And get ready. A mountain will be moved. It doesn't matter that the ground is a zillion times the weight of the seed. The seed will push it back. Every spring, dreamers around the world plant tiny hopes in overturned soil. And every spring, their hopes press against impossible odds and blossom. Never underestimate the power of a seed.

"Don't be satisfied with anything less than all God's powerful grace is able to produce in you and through you."

"The transformative power of grace will be one of the divine wonders that we will celebrate forever when eternity is our final home."





#### Helping Hands


We have a group of people who are ready and willing help you! If you need help please contact the church office and we will try to find someone who can assist you.



# 40 Tables of God's Love

# **Table Fellowship:**

Are you being Jesus at meal time or being something else?

Why is table fellowship of great importance both to the early Christian church and to us today? Can you think of a few reasons? Table fellowship is a theme throughout the Bible, and is used to teach the stories of God to God's people and beyond. The stories of God's prophets often involve eating and sharing the things of God that were needed to be shared and to

connect with eternity. It seems like Jesus was always eating with someone for the same salvation. The Last Supper points to Christ's own sacrifice for our life, and to the Great Banquet that will be held for all of us in heaven. The early Church continued the table fellowship both in daily meals and in holy communion, and so do we.

Christ is present in all of our table fellowship because we are the temple of Christ. (I Cor 6:19) Christ's presence at the table means that we recognize that God is the giver of all good things. We see that Jesus is the "true bread of life." (John 6:33-48) When we eat together, we welcome the Lord's presence. When in the presence of the Lord, we joyfully celebrate the gift of food, the gift of Christ's sacrifice, and the promise of His presence both now and in the future when we partake in the eternal banquet.

God's desire for His people is wonderful table fellowship. It leads us right into the Lord's Table. These relationships are made to be marked with love, and eating is a time of celebration of God's goodness.

What does table fellowship look like when you invite some people that need the presence of Jesus through you? Here are six ingredients that go into table fellowship:

Inviting non-Christians Building community & unity Expressing present and future hope Teaching the Word Sharing Telling the Christian story
