Just Enough Time... to Do God's Will

*"Everyone should eat & drink & take pleasure
in all his toil - this is God's gift to man."
(Ecclesiastes 3:13).*

In a 21st century world where we're over-
worked, overstressed, and over-scheduled, this
may be one of the most significant and freeing
sentences you'll ever read: *You have just enough
time to do God's will.*

That means if you don't feel you have enough
time in your day, one of two things is true.

Either:

- 1) You're doing things God doesn't intend for you to do.
- 2) You're doing the things God intended the wrong way.

God wouldn't give you a list of things to do and not give you the time to do them.
Either you're trying to do too much or you're wasting time.

Either way, you need to learn to enjoy the moment. The Bible says, *"Everyone should
eat and drink and take pleasure in all his toil - this is God's gift to man."* (Ecc. 3:13).

Too many of us fall victim to a terrible trap. I call it "when and then" thinking. We
believe "when" we achieve a particular goal, we'll be happy. Maybe that goal is grad-
uation, marriage, or a financial goal. But you won't be happy then. You'll enjoy
reaching that goal for three seconds, and then you'll start asking yourself, "What's
next?" The cycle simply repeats.

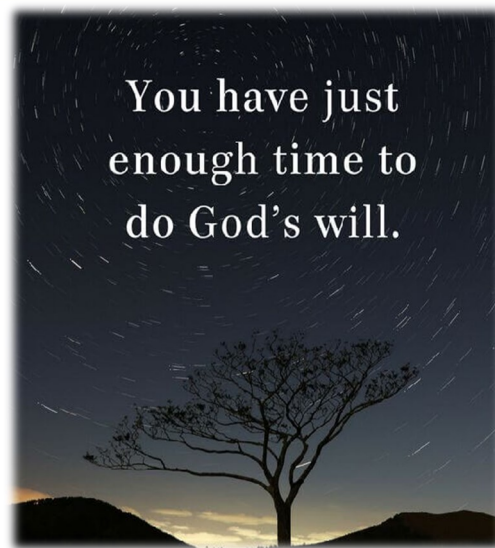
Are you worn out, burnt out, or stressed out? God wants more for you. If you're
carrying an overwhelming load, it isn't from Jesus. He says in Matthew 11, *"Come
to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest... For my yoke is easy, and
my burden is light."* (Matthew 11:28, 30).

Among all the information, application must pour out of us for the sake of the others. The church finds itself guilty of this as well. We have all the information, and opinions and we bloviate heavily. Perhaps a gentle turn, a repentant turn, is needed for the sake of the mission.



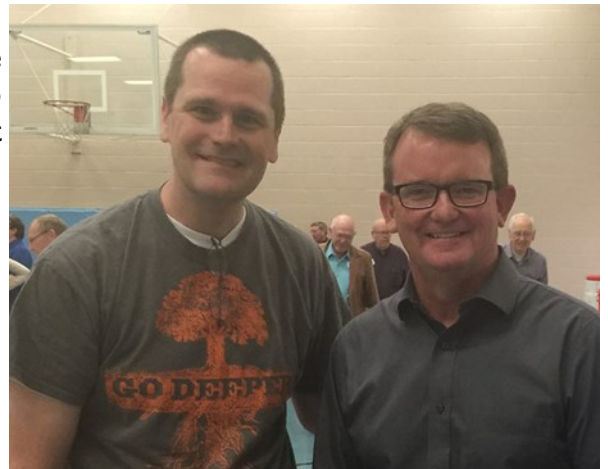
One of my favorite authors, Greg Finke, reminds us that there is a time when you have to put down the book and actually do. We can spend so much time in study, meetings, planning, reporting, and keeping busy with activities that being Jesus in the lives of others is simply lost. Oh, what loss and sadness comes upon the angels as such times this. How this slows down the church to a virtual standstill of missional work. Those angels want every reason to rejoice (Luke 15:6, 9, 32), but they hear yet another report on finances. Can you imagine the deep disappointment of the angels. How those angels love to see the shepherds running to share.

The Council is reviewing and addressing the following issues:

We are exploring a better way to collect donations for our Christian causes, for example: Missionary support or Seminarian support. There is a growing and enthusiastic interest in the Women's Bible Study on Monday evenings at 6:00 pm. This study is hosted and led by our own Amy Dahlke. Ladies, come and join for a "deep-dive" into the heart of our Active Faith.

We certainly applaud the recent events on Spiritual Conversation Workshops. We all know the *why* of the reason to have spiritual conversations constantly - - this presentation helped us to understand the *how* to do this effectively as we fulfill our Lord's direction to spread the Gospel and the faith. The presentation will be repeated in the near future to accommodate our arriving "snow-birds"! Yay !



We will be hosting World Renew workers in teams of 15-20 people at a time. This will be similar to the LERT teams after Hurricane Ian and our CREW team. We have the opportunity to outreach and serve our larger community (currently 100 homes are identified in our area that need assistance from skilled workers to restore their homes to livable conditions).

The Current Schedule for World Renew:

Sept 12 – Sept 22 World Renew teams will be sent to make Renovations to the Youth Room

World Renew Construction teams will show up as follows:

- Team #1 October 7– October 28
- Team #2 October 28– November 18
- Team #3 November 18-December 9

We will be clearing out areas in rooms for World Renew. This areas includes the Youth Room, the Christian Ed Room, Meyer Hall and possibly the Music Room. Current groups using these areas will be asked change or alter their schedules.

We will be looking for people to help World Renew by equipping them to serve, showing hospitality, welcoming them into our homes and community, helping with meals (breakfast and dinners), giving to the families that they are serving, as well as looking for members who have Thrivent Action Grants available to use.

Pastor Dahlke will develop teams that will help connect us to World Renew so we all stay on the same page. For now everything will be run through Pastor Dahlke to avoid duplication.

SPIRITUAL CONVERSATIONS

Last August, Lakeside offered a two-part workshop on spiritual conversations. Research is showing that the American church is not that great at having spiritual conversations. They are not meaning the quality of the spiritual conversations - but rather people are not having them at all. Over the next few months, I will try to review and augment some of the content of the workshops.

Lutheran Hour Ministries shared five points that will help with your intentionality and eagerness of having spiritual conversations. If we engage in these five points our eagerness and intentionality will jump greatly. We can all list the excuses - from apathy, not my responsibility, fear, laziness, or even hubris - but let's look at the good stuff.



2 Corinthians.5:17

Below are the five areas I will cover:

- God's love Transforms us - **Embrace the Gospel**
- God's love Grows us - Apply Spiritual Disciplines
- God's love Empowers us - Grasp the Calling
- God's loves Engages others through us - Expect Spiritual Conversations
- God's love Abides - Respond Confidently

Let's look at the first area by reviewing 2 Cor. 5:17,

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.

The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."

What other verse makes this clear for you?

Embrace the Gospel, then we have a clear and certain understanding that salvation comes from belief in Jesus Christ alone and forgiveness of sins comes only through the death and resurrection of Jesus.

The next five points flow from this grand teaching of scripture:

- I believe everyone needs their sins forgiven.
- I believe forgiveness only comes through the death and resurrection of Jesus.
- I trust in Jesus for eternal life.
- When I think about who I am, I see my primary identity as a child of God.
- I am quick to forgive others.

When we are transformed by the love of Christ, we are compelled by the Gospel (2 Cor. 5:14). We desire all to be saved as God does (1 Tim. 2:4). So spiritual conversations are not optional in faith, but a flowing of love into others wrapped in kindness and grace. Table fellowship is a perfect time for sharing the love of Jesus. Give others the opportunity to share their story as well. As you break bread and sip on the water of life (John 4:14) - Jesus is with you.

Table Fellowship:

Are you being Jesus at meal time or being something else?

Why is table fellowship of great importance both to the early Christian church and to us today? Can you think of a few reasons? Table fellowship is a theme throughout the Bible, and is used to teach the stories of God to God's people and beyond. The stories of God's prophets often involve eating and sharing the things of God that were needed to be shared and to connect with eternity. It seems like Jesus was always eating with someone for the same salvation. The Last Supper points to Christ's own sacrifice for our life, and to the Great Banquet that will be held for all of us in heaven. The early Church continued the table fellowship both in daily meals and in holy communion, and so do we.



Christ is present in all of our table fellowship because we are the temple of Christ. (1 Cor 6:19) Christ's presence at the table means that we recognize that God is the giver of all good things. We see that Jesus is the "true bread of life." (John 6:33-48) When we eat together, we welcome the Lord's presence. When in the presence of the Lord, we joyfully celebrate the gift of food, the gift of Christ's sacrifice, and the promise of His presence both now and in the future when we partake in the eternal banquet.

God's desire for His people is wonderful table fellowship. It leads us right into the Lord's Table. These relationships are made to be marked with love, and eating is a time of celebration of God's goodness.

What does table fellowship look like when you invite some people that need the presence of Jesus through you? Here are six ingredients that go into table fellowship:

Inviting non-Christians
Building community & unity
Expressing present and future hope

Teaching the Word
Sharing
Telling the Christian story

WHAT TO DO FOR A HURRICANE...

1. Stay Informed.

The National Hurricane Center provides constantly updated information without the distractions of advertising and hype.

2. Make a list of the emergency numbers for your utility providers.

Make sure you know who your utility provider is. Know where your fuse box and gas meter are, and clear out anything that might block access.

3. Create a family emergency plan.

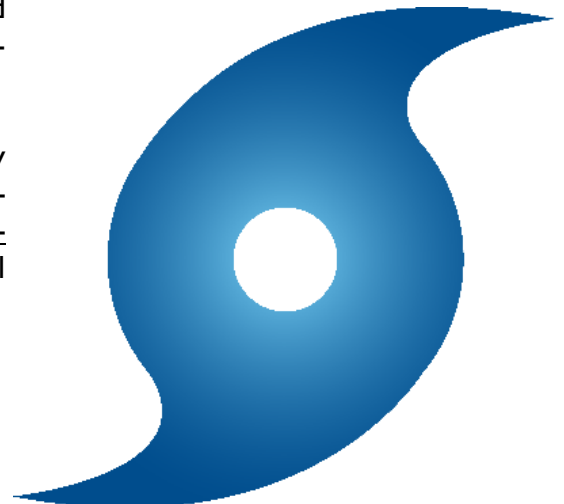
Include ways to meet up, your evacuation checklists and destinations, critical phone numbers, and how you'll communicate if power and cell phone services fail.

4. Assemble a hurricane emergency kit.

Prepare for the specific needs of your family, which may differ if you have pets, people with special needs or no-where to go. Also consider making a hurricane preparedness checklist so you don't forget anything during a stressful time.
