

True joy is found in the Good News that God is for you. We rejoice in this. We vigorously make known the love of Christ.

God's love Engages others through you - Expect Spiritual Conversations

This month we explore part four of our spiritual conversations discussion.

Rewind: God's Love Transforms us - Embrace the Gospel

God's love Grows us - Apply Spiritual Disciplines God's love Empowers us - Grasp the Calling

Spiritual conversations happen because we are transformed not just informed. Spiritual conversations happen because of God's love in us and our love to others. If we have not love we are a high maintenance clanging noise. Spiritual conversations have the power of God in them. When you grasp that they are loving endeavors, full of God's power, we trust in Him and not ourselves. That is beautiful.



God's plan is to do it through you so we can expect spiritual conversations handed to us by God Himself. When you engage others as transformed, loved and powered-filled disciples, He does miracles in and through you in the lives of others. Usually we are so busy critiquing church stuff that we ignore our true Biblical mission.



Let's consider Acts - chapter eight.

Acts 8:30-32 - So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

While some actively seek opportunities to share, many say spiritual conversations happen unexpectedly. We can do both. Which of the following are in your scope?

- [♣] I notice spiritual conversations happening in everyday life.
- 1 look for opportunities to share my faith.
- ♣ I invest time and energy in talking about faith.
- ♣ I look for the unexpected conversation in everyday life.
- ↑ I try to share my faith by the way I live.



What would happen if the members of Lakeside directed there time, energy and strategy to these five bullet points. You may have to talk less about the pastor and more about yourself impacting the lives of others by the power of the Holy Spirit. I'm o.k. with that and I hope you are too. God is blessing your spiritual conversations.

An ordinary stop at Walmart, Venice turned into an extraordinary experience...thanks to 4 Venice High School students. As I approached my car, about 7:20pm, there was an elderly man standing near my car with a few bags of groceries in his cart. He seemed to be looking around for his car. I asked if his car had moved to make light of his confusion. After putting my purchases in my car, I went back to the man to offer assistance finding his car. Within 2 minutes of asking questions...4 angels arrived. 3 young men (members of the VHS lacrosse team) and a lovely, blonde gal, also from VHS. They asked if I would like their assistance...SURE, I WOULD. They walked up and down...and finally 5 aisles away found the car...they came back to escort the man and slowly we made it to the car. The angels put his packages in the car...and it ended with handshakes and hugs. I was so impressed by them ...instead of ignoring the situation and going about their business. they did the right thing. They're in my prayers tonight.

Many years ago, my brother – two years younger than me – was going through a very rough time in his life. Living near Philadelphia, he was a very strong, tough, self-confident man – a real Grizzley Adams guy. Loved to hunt, be outdoors, worked on the railroad (Amtrack). His (then) wife decided to divorce and he was in the deepest despair. He and I spent many hours together in person and on the phone. I mostly listened and he mostly talked. Eventually found out he was diagnosed with Pancreatic cancer. Conversation finally turned to where he could find peace and hope – in Gods embrace. He joined some Christian study group and some outreach from people who cared. My brother died several months later with hope and God's peace in his heart. I have always been forever grateful that I was able to point him in the direction of Christ before he died. I love you brother and I miss you.







Church Council Article - November 2023

Your Lakeside Lutheran Council are guiding and facilitating the following items:


- We will be renewing our contract and lease with The Treehouse for another year in 2024. They
 have plans to convert part of their building space to a "Home-School" environment and project.
 There are still a lot of details and regulations to iron out.
- We have built a slate of candidate nominations for Congregational vote and approval in November at our annual Congregational Meeting. This year nominations are for President, Lead Trustee and Secretary. Candidates will be voted for at the November 8th congregational meeting. Voting is at 5:00 pm in the Sanctuary, and will be followed by dinner in Meyer Hall at 6:00.
- World Renew volunteers have joined us to spread the Christian help to all Gods children in the area that are still needing help restoring their homes from Hurricane IAN (last year!). There will be crews (men and women) rotating in and out each 3 weeks for several months through the end of April. They will be headquartered and stay at our church. The Holy Spirit has truly blessed us with this opportunity to serve others. Having the World Renew teams on site has required some large adjustments and sacrifices for our congregation and campus. Keep in mind that God did not say it would be easy but as He said in John 16:33 "Fear not, for I have overcome the world". He always provides.
- The Seminarian support will become a line-item in our regular budget going forward. This line item is being funded by collections from our Band-of-Brothers and other interested congregants. For clarification, Lakeside also sends general support to the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod and they in turn help support the Synod seminaries with grants.
- Financially, we are doing well thanks to God's provision and the support of all the congregants that are helping to support the Light of Christ going out to our congregants and also outward to the world around us. Also Hallelujah! We are mortgage debt FREE as of the end of October. We will present a new church budget for congregational approval at the November 8th Voters' meeting.
- We are exploring the possibility of an inexpensive "spaghetti dinner" once a month for the parents
 and children from Treehouse Preschool as an opportunity to share our faith and joy. We will
 move forward on this when things settle down a bit with the present adjustments.

To all the souls that help keep our Christian Family alive, vibrant and inspired - Thank You!
