

What is Lent? Do the Scriptures mention it? Why do we observe it?

The Scriptures do not specifically mention Lent, however it has a longstanding tradition in the Church closely derived from the contents of Scripture. As Christ prepared for Good Friday and the Resurrection, so too the Church follows her Lord into sin's death and resurrection life.


Lent engages the Church (and each Christian) in the rhythm and patterns of sanctification: Death to sin and the pursuit of holiness. Lent fosters an intensive time for the baptized to live as the baptized (see Romans 6:1-7).

Lent began very simply as a time of preparation for Easter. From the earliest times it was customary for Christians to fast before Easter ("the Paschal Feast"). It was a fasting before the feasting; a celibacy before the celebration. At first this was a two-day fast (Friday and Saturday). As time passed, this fast was extended.

Lent has two major emphases. First, it is a time of repentance and denial of self. All Christians are to examine their lives according to the Ten Commandments and Jesus' summation of the Law (see Mark 12:30-31) and repent accordingly, but also to strive to "walk in the Spirit" (see Galatians 5:16). Second, it was a time of instruction. During Lent one learns the Christian faith by studying. Upon examination, we are baptized and receive the Lord's Supper in the loy of the service on Easter.

At Reformation time, some of the Christian radicals wanted to eliminate Lent since Scripture did not explicitly command it. Luther, however, urged it be kept, not out of any necessity (one does not need to observe Lent to be either saved or sanctified) but because Luther saw Lent as an opportunity for the strengthening of faith and distinctive proclamation of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection.

Lent gives Christians a wonderful opportunity for spiritual renewal. During this season, the baptized grow in faith and love toward Jesus crucified, and exercise a penitent heart while always keeping an eye on the victory of God on Easter.






Are you joyfully living the truth of God's Word? The Word of God is our inspiration. At Lakeside we are committed to the truth? We are committed to upholding the absolute truth of God's Word. As the world says that the Word of God has become irrelevant, the truth is that it has not changed and will endure forever. "The sum of your word is truth, and every one

of your righteous rules endures forever" (Ps119:160).

How imperative is it that every leader, and non-leader, in the church be committed to the Bible as God's Word - the source of absolute truth? Apart from truth we are compromised and foolishness exits from us. "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).





God wants each of us to be grounded in the truth so that this Biblical foundation does not change. When our foundation moves from the Bible into opinion, division becomes manifested. "So that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes" (Eph. 4:14-15). Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into Him who is the head...

God wants to use each of us to spread the Truth of God's Word with desire. "I must preach the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns as well; for I was sent for this purpose" (Luke 4:43). Jesus has passed that purpose down to us whether we want to do it or not. The Good News is that He gives us the power of the Holy Spirit to do it. Good-bye excuses, hello planting Jesus.

We are committed to applying the truth of God's Word to our daily lives. "For the Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged

sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12).

We call this life style discipleship.


#### **Helping Hands**
