### THE IMPORTANCE of BIBLE STUDY

Bible Stories Activity Book

The basic task of a Bible Study can be summarized as:

A — Hearing and Reading the Bible

B — Learning and Teaching the Bible

C — Prayer

### A — Hearing and Reading the Bible:

People who are not familiar with the basic Bible stories should start off by studying the popular stories (Suggested book: 120 Bible Stories from CPH). Read one story a day, discuss it briefly, and then say the Lord's Prayer. Anyone can be blessed by doing this. Once the stories are well known, move to a ESV Study Bible.

### B — Learning and Teaching the Bible:

God not only wants His Word read, but also learned and talked about in the home (Deut. 6:7). Sometimes this takes two minutes, while other times the discussion will take off and continue for some time. As understanding allows, move on to the catechism and how it applies? Check cross-references in a study Bible. Luther suggests we complete statements like: "From this Scripture God wants me to..." In this way, important conversations will arise naturally from the Bible. Also, on Sunday's, talk about what was learned from the pastor's sermon.

### C — Prayer:


Hymns (ideally sung) fit under prayer. Use the same hymn(s) for a week or more. This enables you to build up a set of memorized hymns. Use Psalms, particular requests, thanksgiving prayers, as well as the Lord's Prayer.

Between the Bible, the catechism, and the hymnal you will have a lifetime of material. The order in which you have a study will change, but it is important to have these three ingredients: (a) Hear and Read the Bible, (b) Discuss and Teach it, (c) Pray.

God's Word is our great heritage and makes for the happiest life (Psalm 119:111). Whether you are single, busy with children, empty nesters, or widowed, it is the blessed hope of heaven and being forever with Christ that brings happiness and joy into our life.

The daily study of God's Word impresses this heavenly hope upon our hearts and brings joy to our daily lives.

Are you joyfully living in faith? When we live in joyful faith God works in great ways in and through us. We need to continually ask ourselves am I committed to walk by faith or by the flavor of the day. At Lakeside we are happy to say that we strive to walk and live joyfully by faith. Alleluia!

Walking by faith generates enthusiasm among the congregation. In Matthew 19:26, Jesus said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." We have this passage memorized. It transforms our heart to trust that God has all the "goings on" in the world in His power and control. It leads us to go forward with power, zeal and strength because He has the whole world in His hands. Alleluia!





Walking by faith activates a loving prayer life. Our faith leads us to be a congregation of prayer. Matthew 21:12 transforms our hearts when it says "If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer." Faith in God leads us to wonderful relational prayer with God Himself. Alleluia!

Walking by faith motivates sacrifice. Romans 12:1 transforms us when

it says "therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." Faith in God leads us to sacrifice without having to invite anyone to a pity party. Alleluia!





Walking by faith produces harmony. Romans 12:16 is designed to transform our hearts and behavior when it says "Live in harmony with one another." Faith produces harmony. Unbelief attacks and divides. You can see it easily in our lives if you look. Often unbelief is so ugly you do not want to look. But by faith we build and edify. It's a Jesus gift. So we joyfully live in faith. Alleluia!




Lastly, and most importantly, we give thanks to our God for all these gifts and the people who are Lakeside Lutheran Church.



As we band together as brothers-in-Christ we become <u>unstoppable</u> for our faith and His glory.



Dear Friends of Haiti,

As you all know from news reports Haiti is in great turmoil. Please pray for Haiti and for all the people we love so dearly. All the reports you hear are true and actually worse in many cases. The good news is that Jeremie is not as bad as Port au Prince and our schools have remained open.

When people ask me why Haiti is in the condition it is in I cannot give them a simple answer. What is happening in Haiti is evil. The gangs and outlaws have no respect for their fellow countrymen. They are desperate people living in desperate times and feel they have nothing to loose if they take what is not theirs. God is not part of



their lives and His laws mean nothing to them. Our Pastors and Christian Teachers are trying desperately to change this. Let us all be aware of what happens when a country turns its back on its Creator.

Several people have said they would like to help by sending funds but fear their donation would never reach the people in need. They've heard of the corruption and hesitate to trust them. I can tell you that every donation you make to the Jeremie Teachers Fund through MISSION HAITI based out of Orlando, FL (formerly the Haitian Lutheran Mission Project) goes directly to the teachers. We send each of our 49 Lutheran School Teachers \$150.00 quarterly. Our Field Director delivers these funds personally to the principals of each of our 7 schools. The \$50 dollars a month our teachers receive is not enough for them to live on, but it helps. If the teachers do not get paid they must seek employment elsewhere and schools will close. Please remember also that as long as we keep our schools open each of our students receives a daily meal of beans and rice (supplied by our friends from Trinity Hope). This is so important..

Please remember that as expensive as things have become in the US, they are many times more expensive in Haiti and these people are literally, LITERALLY starving. Mission Haiti does not go through other agencies. We guarantee that your donations go directly to the people in need.

Please pray for Haiti (pray for the U.S. as well). Though Haiti's condition seems hopeless, it can turn around. God can do marvelous things.

### Susan Gross

Susan has been involved with the Lutheran Church in Haiti for the past 23 years, working with Trinity Hope Feeding Program in TN. She loves the Haitian people. When the board of directors decided to dissolve the Haitian Lutheran Mission Project she joined **MISSION HAITI.** Susan prays that the unrest in Haiti ends and a younger group of people steps up and grows the Church in Haiti.


