Children are heading back to school. Don't forget to teach your child about God, too. Whether a child is 2 or 12, much can be done to lead them into the riches of our Savior. The LCMS offers resources to help. Each week children's bulletin inserts are offered to the kids at Lakeside (located in the narthex, as well as emailed weekly). The bulletins feature topics for the seasons of the church year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost.

"Joyfully Inspiring More and Stronger Disciples"

Lakeside is having a **FOOD DRIVE** to collect Non-Perishable Foods, Toiletries and Cleaning Supplies and pet foods this summer. All donations gathered will be given to South County Food Pantry for distribution - 121 Warfield Ave, Venice, FL 34285 - (941) 408-2911.

The goal of the Food Pantry is to provide food for families who are in need in the Venice, Nokomis, Laurel, and Osprey area. People visit the pantry once per month and get about 10 days worth of food.

The Food Pantry's main goal is to provide support for families who need help for a short time only. 35% of the families are dependent on the services for less than one year. Senior citizens on a limited budget make up 10% of clients (people 70 years and older). Homeless individuals make up 8%. Others who receive food include the disabled.




The Pantry is open every weekday from 9:00 to 12:00 noon.



INCLUDE THE BIBLE AS A PART OF YOUR CHILD'S WISDOM

WISDOM TAKES WORK

Key Verse: Proverbs 1:7

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.

The Map:

As an archaeologist, I love to search for treasure. Sometimes this is backbreaking work! But with all the hard work that comes with the job, I always find a treasure on a dig. The treasure doesn't come to me; I have to go find the treasure! But the work is always worth it. Finding God's wisdom is the same, so let's start digging!

The Dig: Proverbs 2:1-6

- 1. Does wisdom come to us or do we have to find it?
- 2. Write down all the words in these verses that describe an action. Feel free to put these in your own words (For example, in verse 1, we have to "receive" wisdom).
- 3. Take a look at verse 4. What is wisdom compared to?
- 4. What does God promise us?

The Treasure:

We have to go searching for wisdom! Just like I have to search for treasure, we have to look, ask, search, and call out for God's wisdom. The promise from God is that we never come up empty. He always gives wisdom when we ask and search for it!

The Display:

Take a moment and read James 1:5. Make a list of where you need God's wisdom the most right now. Maybe it's with your friends, your attitude, words, or relationship with siblings. Begin by writing those down today!

Often one struggles with finding resources for teaching kids the Bible. Some children have "outgrown" children's Bibles, but are not quite old enough for the ESV Bible. This devotional is shared from <u>The Dig.</u> for parents and kids study.







The 1st Sunday of each month is LWML Mite Sunday. Lakeside LWML supports the Florida-Georgia LWML with our mites. Your mites support




A CHRISTIAN ATTITUDE

It's very difficult <u>not</u> to judge others - but you have to try or you will always be angry/sad. Really try to focus on the Joy of all the blessings we enjoy in our lives every day.
