Could you imagine a cold and bare church on Christmas-Eve? The thought is really sad. Where will His people be? Reducing services is part of a larger movement. In 2005, a number of churches all conspired to cancel the service on Dec.25th (since it fell on a Sunday.) The decision was about "being lifestyle-friendly for people who are just very, very busy." Should churches bow to the culture and become "lifestyle-friendly"? Thankfully, we at Lakeside do not follow that trend. By cancelling even one of these services, it makes all other services vulnerable.

I do get it. Everyone's busy during the holidays. Everyone wants a picture-perfect Christmas. Everyone has someone ready to give them grief for skipping a part of a cozy family Christmas celebration to go to church. As busy as everyone is - Christmas is the birth of our Leader. "The Word became Flesh and dwelt among

us" (John 1:14). The very God who spoke the universe into existence became a tiny baby - a real, live, flesh-and-blood human being for us.

To my fellow Christians I say this: Let's not give our churches any cause to cancel Christmas. Two thousand years ago in Bethlehem, God fulfilled a promise made at the dawn of creation (Gen. 3:15). He became one of us, and that event changes everything! So this Christmas, enjoy time at home with your family. Feast. Make merry. Open presents. Sing carols. Deck the halls. But whatever else you do, make time for worship and go to church.





Dear Lakeside,

I would like to take this time to prayerfully wish you a very Merry Christmas. Christmas joy is a result of Christ being our gift to overcome the sin and pain of the world.



During this season, we will be celebrating Jesus as the Light.

As Christmas approaches, you may be concerned about all kinds of stuff. There are presents to buy, decorations to put up, cards to send, and food to prepare. God wants us to "put on the armor of light."

We often do not think about how we are preparing ourselves for Christmas. We are often too focused on preparing the external rather than the internal. As Advent begins, remember to prepare more than stuff. Prepare your heart and mind, body and soul to be ready when Christ comes again.

We may feel alone or overwhelmed. We may seem to have a fading energy and endurance. Some of you may be dreading the potential conflict that will come when you gather with family and friends for Christmas celebrations. The apostle Paul writes that our God is the God of endurance and encouragement. You may be tired. You may be discouraged. But Christ has visited His people, and He gathers us all so that we may shine more brightly together in this world of darkness and discouragement.

As you prepare for Christmas, may you be encouraged by your brothers and sisters in Christ who shine alongside you and may you do the same for others. As Christmas approaches, it can be difficult to stay focused on our identity and purpose as God's people. It's easy to get swept up in the numerous worldly expectations around us. We often try to make everything perfect. We try to trim the perfect tree, buy the perfect gifts, and cook the perfect meals. Yet we know that perfection exists only in Jesus.

In December we will celebrate perfection being born in a manger. God calls us, His people, away from imperfection and into His perfection. He sets His own Light within us and sets us apart to shine in this dark world. In these few days of Advent, remember that you are set apart for a purpose: to shine the light of Christ.

I am grateful to God that He has sent the Light. This Christmas we celebrate that Light. Without Christs presence among us we would be lost. Through God's presence working within us we are being healed, transformed, reconciled and made whole by the Light. I pray you have a fantastic Christmas.

This can be a time to start that daily devotion habit. A few resources include:


- Portals of Prayer (available quarterly in the Narthex and Church Office).

- December 23 and 31 there will be no Bible study Merry Christmas to everyone!



Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German Lutheran Pastor, theologian, and anti-Nazi dissident. His writings on Christianity's role in the secular world have become widely influential; his 1937 book *The Cost of Discipleship* is described as a modern classic. Apart from his theological writings, Bonhoeffer was known for his staunch resistance to the Nazi dictatorship, including vocal opposition to Adolf Hitler's euthanasia program and genocidal persecution of the Jews. LWML Mighty Mites




Helping Hands





WELCOME BACK and POTLUCK

There was a ball of mud that sat along the road. The ball of mud thought of itself as of no consequence at all - unimportant - not worth much if anything. For a very long time, many passed by the ball of mud and never even noticed it. The people just ignored it and went on their way. The animals and carts just went on by and didn't notice it at all.

One day the Master, Jesus, came by. Along with the Master were His disciple followers. There was a man born blind from birth set before them. The disciples asked the Master why this man was blind, what sin had he committed, or was it his parents that sinned. The Master said neither had happened. This man was born blind so that the works of God could be shown through him. As He said this, the Master bend down and picked up the ball of mud and held it.

The ball of mud felt warm and <u>good</u> to be in His hands, and the ball of mud felt somehow important. Jesus started to squeeze the mud and then did something strange. He spit saliva on the mud so that God could work with the mud and the power of the Holy Spirit. Then He spread the mud on the blind man's eyes, anointed him and told him to go wash the mud off in the pool of Siloam (which means "sent"). As the man washed off the mud, suddenly he could see light, see colors, and see the birds that he could hear singing for so long. The mud was washed away and having performed it's mission of light and salvation, the mud was dismissed.

Jesus explained: ⁴ "We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work. ⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." (John 9: I-7)

Are we the "ball of mud" that is <u>sent</u> to open the eyes of others and point them toward the only true light of salvation in Jesus; <u>OR</u> are we the one who's eyes were opened to believe that only through the light of Christ can we see, knowing all other paths lead to darkness and are nothing!

Remember: The only path to light and Joy is through Christ.
